1	When do I need to register my unmanned aircraft?	Any UA with a total weight of above 250 grams must be registered with the Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore before it can be operated in Singapore.				
		Effective from 2 April 2020, it will be an offence to operate an unregistered UA with a total weight of above 250 grams in Singapore.

2	I am a foreigner visiting Singapore. Do I need to register my unmanned aircraft?	Yes, foreigners, who wish to operate their unmanned aircraft (UA) with a total weight of above 250 grams, must register their UA before they fly in Singapore.

	Do I need to register my unmanned aircraft if I already hold an Operator Permit?	Yes, you are required to register your unmanned aircraft before you fly if it has a total weight of above than 250 grams, regardless of whether you already hold an Operator Permit.				
3		An Operator Permit is an authorisation granted by CAAS to permit an individual or an entity to operate unmanned aircraft for specific purposes. This is different from unmanned aircraft registration.				
4	Who should register the unmanned aircraft belonging to Institutes of Higher Learning (IHL) or schools?	The IHL or school should register the unmanned aircraft using its CorpPass account.				
5	If I purchase an unmanned aircraft but not fly it, do I have to register it?	No, registration is only required if you intend to fly your unmanned aircraft.				
6	I am only intending to fly my unmanned aircraft indoors. Do I need to register my unmanned aircraft?	Yes, if your unmanned aircraft has a total weight of more than 250 grams, you are required to register it before you fly regardless of where you intend to fly.				
		No, registrants must be at least 16 years old.				
7	I am below 16 years old. Can I register my unmanned aircraft?	For a person who is below 16 years old, his or her unmanned aircraft (UA) must be registered by a person who is eligible to register the UA. In such instances, it is strongly encouraged for parents or legal guardians of a person below 16 years to register the unmanned aircraft of their children / wards. Please note that the registered owner of the UA is responsible for the activities of their unmanned				
		aircraft. They must ensure that persons operating their UA are competent to operate it in a safe and responsible manner.				

8	Can I allow my friend to fly my registered unmanned aircraft? Does he or she need to register the same unmanned aircraft again, but under his or her name?	 The registered owner of the UA is responsible for the activities of their unmanned aircraft. You must ensure that persons operating their UA are competent to operate it in a safe and responsible manner. Hence, while you may give your friend permission to use an UA registered in your name, you will be held responsible should there be any contravention to the rules. However, if you intend to transfer ownership of your UA to your friend, you should de-register your UA and remove the registration label from the UA. Your friend will be required to purchase a new registration label and complete the registration.
9	I want to sell my registered unmanned aircraft. Can I transfer the ownership of the registration label?	If you intend to sell your registered unmanned aircraft, you should de-register your UA and remove the registration label from the UA. The new owner of the UA will be required to purchase a new registration label and complete the registration.
10	When should I de-register my unmanned aircraft?	 You should de-register your UA under any of the following situations: If the UA is lost or damaged beyond repair; When the registration label is damaged or when the information on the label becomes illegible; When intending to transfer the ownership of the UA to someone else.
11	Does the registration of the unmanned aircraft have a validity period?	No, the registration does not have an expiry date. It is a one-time registration.
12	What should I do if I damage my registration label?	In the case where the registration label is damaged or has been tampered with, it will be rendered invalid. You will be required to de-register the UA and purchase a new registration label for a new registration.
13	Where do I stick the registration label on my unmanned aircraft?	The registration label must be affixed on the outer surface of a non-detachable part of the unmanned aircraft (e.g. top surface of the main body) and be clearly visible. Do not stick the registration label on places such as the removable battery, propeller guard or propeller. For more information, click <u>here</u> .
14	How do I register my unmanned aircraft?	You will first need to purchase a registration label <u>online</u> , or from a designated SingPost Post Office. Once you obtain the label, visit the <u>online UA Portal</u> to complete the registration process. For more information, click <u>here</u> .
15	What form of photo identification (ID) is required in order to purchase the registration label?	Only valid NRIC, FIN or Passport will be accepted as a valid photo ID for Singaporeans and Permanent Residents. For non-Singaporeans and non-Permanent Residents, only FIN or Passport will be accepted as a valid photo ID. A digital photo ID is required for those who wish to purchase the registration label online, while those who purchase at any of the designated SingPost Post Offices will be required to submit a photocopy of their photo ID.

16	If I have chosen to buy the registration label online, how long will it take to be mailed to me?	Please allow up to 5 working days for the registration label to be mailed to you. Only Singapore addresses are accepted.
17	How much does the registration cost?	The registration fee for each unmanned aircraft is \$15. This fee is payable when you purchase the registration label online (with postage included), or over-the-counter at the designated SingPost Post Offices.
18	Is there a limit to the number of registration labels I can buy?	Singaporeans and Permanent Residents are eligible to purchase up to 5 registration labels, while non- Singaporeans and non-Permanent Residents are eligible to purchase 1 registration label only. If you wish to purchase more than the purchasing limits, you may write in to CAAS (<u>ua_registration@caas.gov.sg</u>). Please note that such requests will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
19	Is there a limit to the number of unmanned aircraft I can register under my name?	No, there is no limit to the number of unmanned aircraft that you can register under your name.
